Plainville Recreation Department

The Plainville Recreation Department provides a wide variety of recreational and leisure programs on a seasonal and year-round basis that promote the physical and cultural well-being of all residents in the community. Programs range from swimming instruction, exercise classes, and various arts and crafts to sports clinics, dance classes, and skiing and snowboarding trips. Regardless of participant age or time of year, the Plainville Recreation Department prides itself on offering fun, affordable, and engaging activities for all.

In addition to planning year-round classes and programs, Plainville Recreation also oversees the many parks and recreational assets of the Town. Located on South Washington Street, Norton Park boasts soccer fields and baseball diamonds, a skate park, a recently renovated playground, picnic sites, and the Elizabeth Berner Pool Aquatic Center – offering citizens the ability to participate in outdoor swim lessons or free swim periods throughout the Summer months. Additionally, Norton Park hosts the annual Hot Air Balloon Festival sponsored by the Plainville Fire Company each August and is the location of Town-run Summer Camps, recently updated Activity Building, Pool House, and a newly constructed concession stand. Off Cooke Street, Paderewski Park offers tennis and basketball courts, a splashpad, a recently renovated playground, picnic sites, fishing pond, and ball fields, while Trumbull Park is home to Plainville Little League.

Complementing Plainville's spacious parks are the multiple indoor facilities which host various programs and events each year. The beneficiary of recent renovations, Plainville High School offers an indoor pool and diving area that serve as the home of swim lessons, a diving and swim team, lifeguarding classes, free swim periods, and water aerobics in the Fall, Winter and Spring, while Plainville High's gym also offers youth and adult basketball leagues. Plainville Middle School's gym hosts various adult basketball leagues, while Linden Street School's gym offers co-ed volleyball. Additional programs and leisure-focused classes including yoga, various dance and group exercise classes, toddler tumble time, dog training and more are hosted at one of the many other spacious municipal buildings across Town including the Public Library, Recreation Building, or one of the five schools in Town.
